1. a. Identify the client according to					
employer policy.					
b. Check the care plan for a

2. Ask two co-workers to help you.					
3. Explain the procedure to the client.					
4. Collect the following supplies:					
□ Stretcher covered with a sheet					
□ Sheet					
□ Slider board					
☐ Pillow(s), if needed					
5. Perform hand hygiene.					
6. Provide for privacy.

7. Raise the bed to a height equal to the					
height of the stretcher.					
8. You and your co-workers should					
position yourselves properly. Two					
workers stand on the side of the bed					
where the stretcher will be. The third					
worker stands on the other side of the					
bed. You and your helpers should					
communicate directions throughout the					
procedure.					
9. Cover the client with a sheet.					
10. Fan-fold top linens to the foot of the bed.					
11. Lower the head of bed so that it is					
as flat as possible.					
12. Lower bed rails, if used.					

13. Being careful to secure the client's			
safety, log-roll the client onto one side.			
Place the slider board underneath the			
client, from the head to the legs,			
between the bed and the bottom sheet.			
Do not place the slider board directly			
next to the client's skin.			
14. Log-roll the client onto the back.			
Position the client in good body			
alignment. Place the pillow under the			
client's head, and ensure that the client			
is comfortable. The top sheet may			
remain on the client, if the client so			
desires.			
15. Ask your co-workers to help move			
the client to the side of the bed by			
grasping the handles of the slider board.			
16. Protect the client from falling, and			
have your co-workers position the			
stretcher next to the bed. They should			
stand behind the stretcher.			
17. Lock the bed and stretcher wheels.			
18. Roll up and grasp the slider board as			
shown in FIGURE 14.13. (Note: To			
prevent back injuries to themselves,			
staff may have to kneel on the bed).			
19. Transfer the client to the stretcher			
on the count of three by lifting and			
pulling the client. Make sure the client is			
centred on the stretcher.			
20. Place a pillow or pillows under the			
client's head and shoulders, if allowed.			
21. Provide for safety and comfort.			
22. Fasten safety straps. Raise the			
stretcher side rails.			
23. Unlock the stretcher's wheels.			
Transport the client.

25. Reverse the procedure to return the			
client to bed.
